

LIVESTREAMING. HOW DOES IT WORK?

INNERchamber will be using livestreaming like a live broadcast. Through our video partner **Fisher Media**, we will connect the live concert to your electronic device. To view the broadcast, all you have to do is purchase a livestream ticket. A confirmation email will be sent to you containing instructions on how to use your own unique, individual access to view the concert from your laptop or tablet.

This approach allows us the flexibility to make in-person tickets available closer to the concert date, if local health and safety recommendations permit us to do so. As we continue to offer great concerts, your safety and comfort remain our priority.

We are offering the following ticket options for Season 11:

Livestream Concert + Meal

Individual access to the livestream concert PLUS a light meal from our Restaurant Partner. **\$35.00*** per person

Livestream Concert + Meal - for Students

Individual access to the livestream concert PLUS a light meal from our Restaurant Partner. **\$10.00** per student

Livestream Concert only

Access for your household to the livestream concert. No meal included **\$35.00** per household

* If current health regulations allow, you may be able to join us in-person at the venue for an additional \$10. We will notify you closer to the concert date if this is possible.

Your Dining Experience

Meals can be picked up at the Restaurant Partner from **5:30 pm** on the day of the concert. Delivery of your meal, if preferred, will also be available. Instructions will be provided closer to each concert.

If we are allowed an in-person audience, dining patrons will be welcomed from **5:30 pm**. All concerts will begin at **7:00 pm**.


FINDING A NEW WAY
